It is defined as 0 degrees latitude and passes through 14 countries, including several in Africa, Indonesia, Ecuador and Colombia. On March 20 th (the first day of Spring) and September 23 rd (the first day of Fall), the sun is directly overhead at the equator. About 1600 miles north of the equator is an imaginary line called the Tropic of Cancer . It is the furthest point north that the sun can be directly overhead which occurs on the first day of summer on June 22 nd . Six months later on December 23 rd , the sun is directly overhead of the imaginary line called Tropic of Capricorn in the southern hemisphere.
