- 18. A tree is defined as being a **perennial** woody plant. A perennial plant is a plant that lives for more than two years. Trees certainly meet this criteria as some trees live to be several thousand years old and have grown to 375 ft (115 m) in height. One way to determine the age of a tree is by inspecting its growth rings after it has been cut down, although this can only be done in climates with definite seasons. Ring thickness in trees shows the amount of rain a region has received in one year. Wide rings mean that rainfall was plentiful while narrow rings mean that the rainfall that year was
