- The **equator** is the imaginary line around the center of the earth and divides the earth into the northern and southern hemispheres. It is defined as 0 degrees latitude and passes through 14 countries, including several in Africa, Indonesia, Ecuador and Colombia. On March 20<sup>th</sup> (the first day of Spring) and September 23<sup>rd</sup> (the first day of Fall), the sun is directly overhead at the equator. About 1600 miles north of the equator is an imaginary line called the **Tropic of Cancer**. It is the furthest point north that the sun can be directly overhead which occurs on the first day of summer on June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Six months later on December 23<sup>rd</sup>, the sun is directly overhead of the imaginary line called **Tropic of Capricorn** in the southern hemisphere. All locations between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn have very warm climates and are part of the tropics, and therefore, have what is called a \_\_\_\_\_ climate.
